We currently have meetings going on in various facilities throughout the district. In Beckley we have The Oaks and Turning Pointe at FMRS, Brian's Safehouse, as well as the women's sober living Open Hearts. In Summersville we have St. Joseph Recovery Center, as well as our newest treatment meeting at Seneca Health, which meets Thursdays at 7pm in the main building on Wellness Drive, across from Recovery Ridge. This meeting is open to the public so feel free to stop by and spread a little of your experience, strength, and hope!

Here in Beckley, we have been given the amazing opportunity to bring a Literature Meeting/Step Study into FMRS, in addition to our already established Monday night meetings there. Thanks to a sizable literature contribution from Steps To Freedom, we are one step closer to bringing the program of AA into this facility! What we really need now are members with a year or more sober and a working knowledge of the 12 steps who are willing to take a commitment to chair these literature meetings, where we will cycle through the first few chapters of the Big Book and the 12 & 12, and discuss the first 3 steps of our program. Finding My Way. A story directly related to our featured Treatment Center article in the 2nd issue.

I guess it all started when I was 14 years old. My sister and I started to drink beer, and from then on, and throughout my life I became dependent on alcohol to solve my problems, so I thought. In reality, it created so many more problems and eventually lead me to rehab where I would find myself and a sponsor. After burning my life to the ground again, at 46 years old, losing everything and on the verge of losing custody of my children, it lead me to rehab, and on my fifth day there we were outside and out walks this guy who was so happy and I thought "why is he so happy, this is rehab!". I was told he was here for the weekly AA meeting. So, I went to the meeting, and he tells us his story and then I started really wondering how he was so happy. Little did I know that he would become my sponsor and a vital role in my recovery. So, when I got out of rehab, I called him up and started going to meetings and working the Steps of the AA Program and getting closer to my Higher Power. I call my higher power by his street name God. By working these 12 Steps, being spiritually fit, and applying these 12 Steps in all of my affairs, my kids are coming home, I have a place to live, a job and I am building a life I can be proud to say I have earned, but I did not do it alone. I am powerless today. I am grateful to AA and so many others for helping me to find my way.

A LITTLE LOCAL HISTORY

My name is Ben, and I am an alcoholic. As a newcomer, I was fortunate to get to hear the local history of AA from a "not so newcomer" named Cormie. This Eat-n-Speak took place on November 17, 2023, in the basement of Beckley Presbyterian Church (Steps to Freedom). A small book could be written on Cormie's stories of his introduction to AA. Below is a recap of his personal AA history with a little local History!

In 1959 he joined an AA group in Frankfurt Germany.

In 1961 he and his family moved to Maryland.

In 1961 he was ordered back to Germany.

In 1977 he moved to Beckley, WV with 17 years sobriety.

In 1978 he found the SWV Fellowship Home.


To continue his program of recovery and service:

- He found a group of 6-8 alcoholics at St. Stephen's. The St. Stephen's AA group which was founded in 1946!
- Cormie also found groups to attend in Oak Hill, Mullins, Mt. Hope and BARH as well.
- In 2000, he attended Summer Fun Round Up at 4H Camp.
- He created a Saturday night meeting at the fellowship home, which attracted a huge crowd.
- He served on the board of directors for the fellowship-home and FMRS provided referrals to the home where alcoholics could get shelter, meals, and AA meetings.
- He also ran a DUI program (required for repeating offenders and offenses with a high BAC) prior to regular DUI class.

What an impressive contribution to AA in Beckley. Thank you, Cormie, for your dedication and service!
